### Bill Crabtree


*"Putting it together for WA"*

- Better triazine efficacy—less weeds are stimulated to germinate
- Shields are an option—creates versatility
- More P uptake—deep banding works
- Reduced stubble blockages at seeding
- Less herbicide, fungicide and insecticides
- They are simple to do
- Taller lupins
